PUBLIC NOTICE NOTICE OF PROPOSED RESOLUTION OF NECESSITY FOR CONSTRUCTION OF STORM WATER SEWERS IN STORM WATER SEWER DISTRICT NO. 4.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN That the Mayor and City Council of the City of Papillion will meet on the 7 day of March, 1967, at 8 o'clock P.M., in the City Hall in said City to hear all objections to the following resolution, to-wit:

RESOLUTION OF NECESSITY BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Papillion, Sarpy County, Nebraska:

Section 1. The Mayor and City Council deem it advisable and necessary to construct a system of storm water sewers in a part of the City of Papillion, Nebraska, as hereinafter provided, and to pass this resolution of necessity for that purpose.

Section 2. There is hereby created in the City of Papillion, a storm water sewer district known as Storm Water Sewer District No. 4. No special assessments are to be levied in said district.

Section 3. The sewers constructed in said District shall be in accordance with the plans and specifications prepared by Hemmingson, Durbin, & Richardson, for the City and filed with the City Clerk on the 7th day of February, 1967; reference to which plans and specifications are hereby made. The sewers shall be constructed of cement concrete pipe, vitrified clay pipe and any other material deemed suitable and be storm water sewers.

Section 4. The size of the pipe, location and terminal points of the sewers shall be as follows:

54" dia. pipe from the northwest corner of 3rd Street and Garden Street; thence north westerly to the southeast corner of Lot 9, Block 2nd Addition; thence north to 4th Street, 48" dia. pipe north to existing culvert under 6th Street,

Beginning at the intersection of the south line of 6th Street and the East line of Grandview Avenue; thence south along the East line of Grandview Avenue to the north line of 3rd Street; thence East along the north line of 3rd Street to the East corporate limit line; thence North along the East corporate limit line to the South line of 6th Street; thence West along the South line of 6th Street to the point of beginning.

Section 5. To pay the cost of said improvements, the Mayor and City Council, after said improvements have been completed and accepted, shall cause to be issued negotiable bonds of the City, known as "Sewer Bonds". There shall be levied and collected annually upon all the taxable property in the City a tax which shall be sufficient to meet the payments of interest and principal of the bonds as the same become due; said tax shall be known as "Sewer Tax" and shall be payable annually in money. All of said improvements are declared to be general public improvements and for the benefit of all the property in the City. All of said improvements are found and declared to be necessary and proper to furnish a storm water sewer system for the City.

Section 6. The engineer's estimate of the construction cost of the proposed storm water sewers is \$55,095.60 and the total cost of said improvements is \$64,049.25.
