USE PERMIT NO. 64

WHEREAS, Samuel P. Olson has submitted an application in accordance with Section 27.31.100 of the Lincoln Municipal Code designated as Use Permit No. 64 for authority to construct a 146,100 sq. ft. neighborhood shopping center on property located at the northeast corner of 14th Street and Old'Cheney Road, and legally described to wit:

Lots 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, and 8, Block 1, Lincoln Industrial Park South, Lincoln, Lancaster County, Nebraska; and

WHEREAS, the real property adjacent to the area included within the plot plan for this neighborhood shopping center will not be adversely affected; and

WHEREAS, said plot plan together with the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth are consistent with the intent and purpose of Title 27 of the Lincoln Municipal Code to promote the public health, safety, morals, and general welfare.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Lincoln, Nebraska:

That the application of Samuel P. Olson, hereinafter referred to as "Permittee", to construct a neighborhood shopping center be and the same is hereby granted under the provisions of Section 27.31.100 of the Lincoln Municipal Code upon condition that construction and operation of said shopping center be in strict compliance with said application, the plot plan, and the following additional express terms, conditions, and requirements:

- 1. This permit approves the development of a 146,100 square foot neighborhood shopping center, consisting of a grocery store, retail stores and small shops, a 4,000 square foot restaurant, and a 3,200 square foot pad site financial facility, and associated parking as shown on the approved site plan.
 - 2. Before receiving building permit the City Council must approve:
 - a. Change of Zone 2772.
 - b. A waiver of the front yard setback on South 14th Street to permit the delivery and truck turn-around as shown on the site plan.
 - c. A modification of the front yard requirements on Old Cheney Road and South 14th Street to permit the fountains as shown on the site plan.
 - 3. Before receiving building permits, the construction plans must comply with the approved plans.
 - 4. Before occupying this neighborhood shopping center all development and construction shall comply with the approved plans.
 - 5. All privately owned improvements, including landscaping, shall be permanently maintained by the permittee.
 - 6. The permittee shall complete all transportation improvements required to be completed by permittee under the Transportation Improvements Agreement which attached hereto, marked as Attachment A, and made a part hereof by reference.

8. The Permittee shall sign and return the City's letter of acceptance to the City Clerk within 30 days following approval of this use permit, provided, however, said 30-day period may be extended up to six months by administrative amendment. The City Clerk shall file a copy of the resolution approving this use permit and the letter of acceptance with the Register of Deeds, filing fees therefor to be paid in advance by the Permittee.

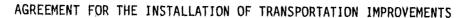

(Use Permit 64 - South 16th Street and Old Cheney Road)

This agreement is entered into on this $\underline{29}$ day of October, 1993, by and between the City of Lincoln, Nebraska, a municipal corporation, hereinafter referred to as the "City", and Sam P. Olson, hereinafter referred to as "Permittee".

RECITALS

- A. Permittee has requested approval of a permit designated as Use Permit No. 64 to authorize the development of a neighborhood shopping center in the vicinity of South 16th Street and Old Cheney Road in Lincoln, Nebraska, on property legally described as Lots 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8, Block 1, Lincoln Industrial Park South, Lincoln, Lancaster County, Nebraska, "the Property".
- B. The development and operation of said neighborhood shopping center will result in increased traffic on the public street system that serves and provides access to the property. In order to protect and promote the public health, safety, and welfare, the City has determined that, as a condition of said use permit, the Permittee should assume a portion of the financial responsibility for certain street improvements as hereinafter identified.
- C. As a condition of said use permit, the City has required the execution and delivery of this agreement which provides for the design, construction, and allocation of costs relating to the required improvements, and the Permittee, by executing this agreement, recognizes its cost responsibility for such improvements.

NOW, THEREFORE, in order to fulfill the conditions of Use Permit No. 64, and to insure the proper and timely funding and construction of necessary public transportation improvements required by the uses authorized by under said use permit, the parties do agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Permittee's Responsibilities</u>. The Permittee shall, at its own cost and expense, be responsible for the following improvements:
 - a. Construction of a westbound right turn lane in Old Cheney Road east from 16th Street approximately 250 feet.
 - b. Widening of 16th Street from the north line of Old Cheney Road north approximately 430 feet to provide a 55 foot wide pavement cross-section.
 - The purchase and installation of a traffic signal at the intersection of 16th and Old Cheney Road, which traffic signal shall be in accordance with the design required by the City Traffic Engineer.
- 2. <u>City's Responsibilities</u>. The City shall, at its own cost and expense, be responsible for the following improvements:
 - a. Increase the northbound right turn $\underline{\text{storage}}$ in 14th Street south of Old Cheney Road.
 - b. Make necessary modifications to the existing traffic signal hardware at 14th and Old Cheney Road.

- c. Design and engineer the proposed traffic signal to be installed by the Permittee at 16th and Old Cheney Road.
- 3. Specifications. All work required hereunder shall be performed in accordance with the City of Lincoln's Standard Specifications for Municipal Construction. The Permittee shall obtain executive orders from the City of Lincoln to perform the work required above, which executive orders must be requested and issued at or prior to the time of issuance of any building permits for the structures to be constructed under the authority of Use Permit No. 64. Upon completion and acceptance, all work performed by the Permittee shall become the property of the City of Lincoln.
- 4. Traffic Light Warrant. The City of Lincoln, by execution of this agreement, does hereby recognize that the installation of a traffic signal at South 16th Street and Old Cheney Road will meet the warrant requirements as established by the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices upon completion of the building for the major tenant of the premises covered by Use Permit 64.
- 5. Right-of-Way. In the event that any additional right-of-way or public access easements are required for any of the improvements contemplated under this agreement, the same shall be acquired by the City, by purchase if possible or by condemnation if necessary, but all costs thereof shall be paid by the Permittee.
- 6. <u>Timing</u>. All work to be performed by the Permittee under this agreement must be completed prior to the issuance of any occupancy permit for any structures authorized by Use Permit No. 64.
- 7. Amendments. This agreement may only be amended or modified by writing signed by both parties.
- 8. Binding effect. This agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit and burden of this successors and assigns of the parties. In the event that the Permittee fails to complete any of the work required hereunder, such failure may, at the option of the City, be deemed to be a violation of Use Permit No. 64, and, in addition to any other remedies that it may have, the City may avail itself of the remedies for violation of the use permit as set forth in the permit, including, but not limited to, revocation thereof.
