Whereas, there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Lincoln, Nebraska, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress, approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of *Prosser Seymour* has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the

quarter of Section twenty eight in township ten north of range three west in the district of lands subject to sale at Lincoln Nebraska, containing eighty acres.

according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:
Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said *Prosser Seymour* the tract of land above described, to have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *Prosser Seymour* heirs and assigns forever.
