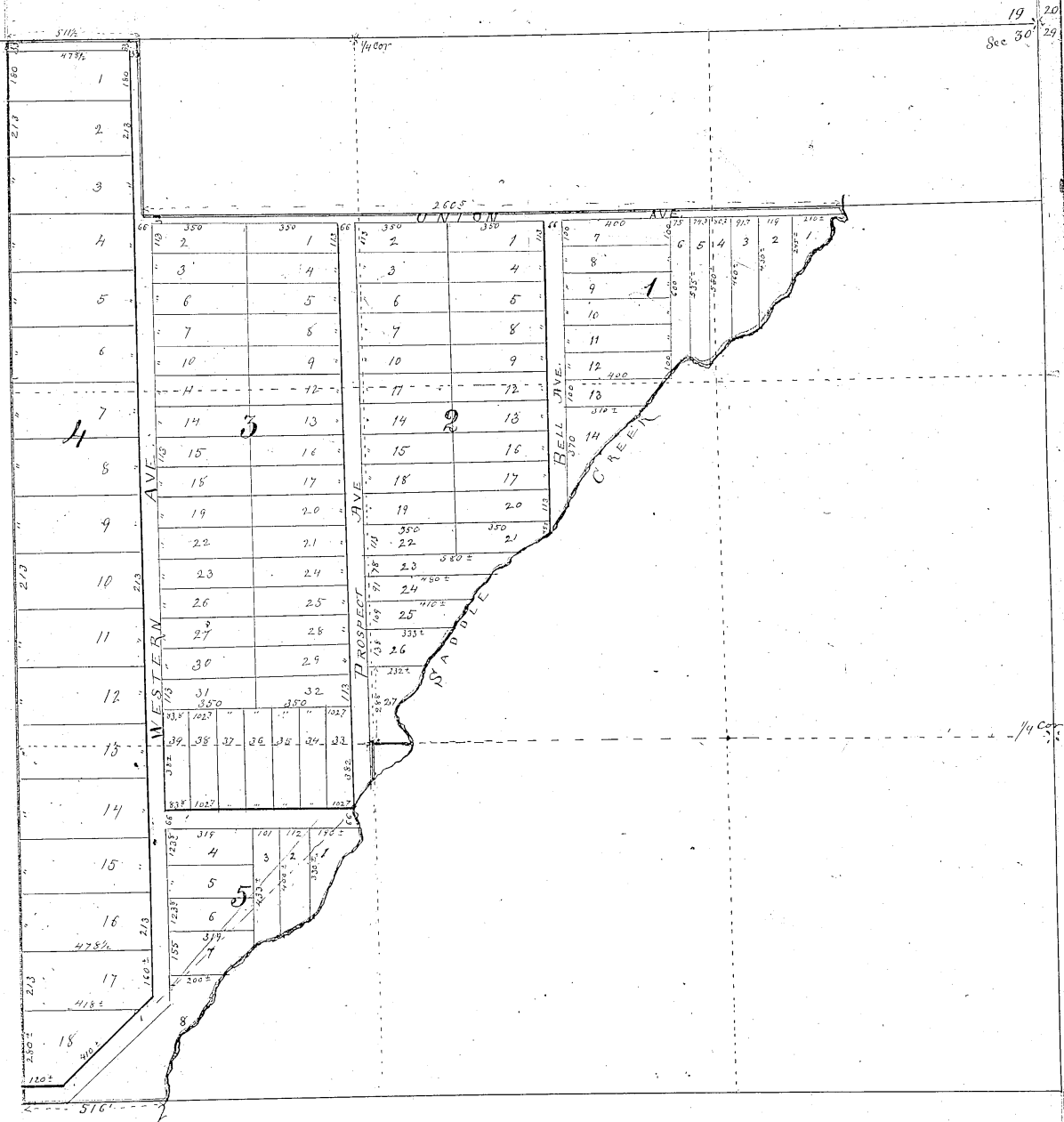


BROOKLINE



I certify that I have surveyed and staked the street and lots in "Brookline" as shown on the above plat it being the following described piece of land to wit: Beginning at the N.W. Cor. of the N.E. 1/4 of the N.W. 1/4 of Sec 30, T. 15, N. R. 13, E. thence East 511 1/2 ft. thence South 660 ft. thence East 266.5 ft. more or less to the present channel of Saddle Creek thence South West along the present channel of Saddle Creek to the North line of the S.E. 1/4 of said Sec 30. thence West 130 ft. more or less to the center of said Sec 30. thence

South 110 ft more or less to present Channel of
Saddle Creek, thence South Westly along the present
Channel of Saddle Creek to the south line of the
N⁸ of S¹ of said Sec 30. thence West 516 ft more
or less to the SW cor. of the N⁸ of S¹ of said Sec
30. thence North 3960 ft. to point of beginning.

approve said plat.

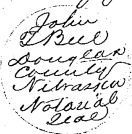
