The United States of America;

Do all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting;

Whereas there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Beatrice Nebraska, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress, approved 20th May 1862, "To secure Homesteads to actual Settlers on the Public Domain" and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Charles A. Baker has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the North-West quarter of Section Four, in Township Three North of Range One West in the district of Lands subject to sale at Beatrice, Nebraska, containing one hundred and sixty acres and seventy-five hundredths of an acre, Excess paid as per receipt No. 2882, according to the official Plat of the Survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General.

Now know ye, that there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said Charles A. Baker, the tract of land above described; To have and to hold the said tract of Land with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Charles A. Baker and to his heirs and assigns forever.

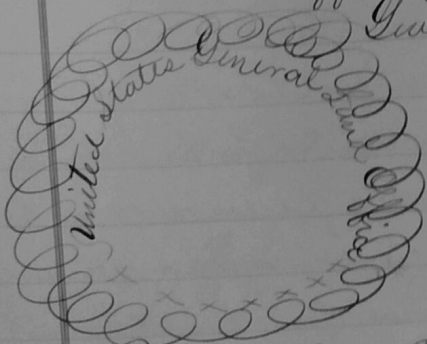

Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, the thirtieth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy four and of the independence of the United States the ninety-ninth.
