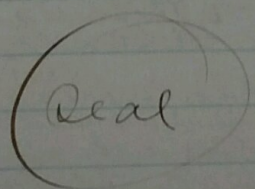

To all to whom these presents shall come greeting  
Whereas There has been deposited in the General  
Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register  
of the Land Office at Beatrice Nebraska whereby it appears  
that pursuant to the act of Congress approved 20<sup>th</sup> May  
1862 to secure Homesteads to actual settlers on the Public  
domain and the acts supplemental thereto the claim of  
Lewis Willard has been established and duly consummated  
in conformity to law for the

South half of the North East quarter of Section Four  
in Township Three north of Range One west of the six  
principal meridian in Nebraska containing eighty  
acres according to the official plat of the survey of said  
lands returned to the General Land Office by the sur-  
veyor General Now know ye that there is therefore granted  
by the United States unto the said Lewis Willard the tract  
of land above described to have and to hold the said  
tract of land with the appurtenances thereof unto the  
said Lewis Willard and to his heirs and assigns for  
ever

In Testimony whereof I Chester A. Arthur President of  
the United States of America have caused the letters  
to be made Patent and the seal of the general land  
office to be hereunto affixed

Given under my hand at the City of Washington  
the tenth day of May in the year of our Lord One thousand  
eight hundred and of the independence of the  
United States the one hundred and sixth
