Haug, Deceased, and the court being fully advised in the premises finds that all parties have either signed the petition for determination of inheritance tax or have signed voluntary appearances and waives notice of time and date of hearing for determination of inheritance tax and the court being fully advised in the premises finds:

1. That the deceased died on May 20, 1967, a resident of Sarpy County, Nebraska, and that she left surviving her, her husband, John M. Haug; Paul Haug, son; Robert Haug, son; Donald Haug, son; and Blake Moore, daughter.

2. That Louise A. Haug, deceased, and John M. Haug, her husband, were, on May 20, 1967, the owners of the following described property as joint tenants with right of survivorship and that on the date said property had a fair market value as set out following description of said property:

- a) The West Half of the Northwest Quarter in Section 29, Township 14 North, Range 12, East of the 6th P.M., Sarpy County, Nebraska containing 80 acres-\$21,720.00
 - b) The North Half of the Northeast Quarter in Section 32, Township 14 North, Range 12, East of the 6th P.M., Sarpy County, Nebr. containing 76.40 acres-\$33,320.00
 - c) The Southwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of Section 32, Township 14 North, Range 12, East of the 6th P.M., Sarpy County, Nebraska, containing 40 acres \$12,880.00
 - d) Checking Account, South Omaha Stockyards National Bank, Omaha, Nebraska 4,358.83
