

Rogers to City of Omaha

I now all men by these presents, that I & Samuel E. Rogers and Martha Rogers of Omaha City, in Douglas County, Territory of Nebraska, for a valuable consideration, do hereby grant, demise, release and forever quit claim unto the City of Omaha in the County and Territory aforesaid, the following described Streets and alleys as shown on the Lithographed map of said City published by Poppleton and Byers in AD 1857 to wit: Pierce Street from the north and south center line of the north East quarter of Section twenty seven to the north and south center line of Section twenty six, in Township No. fifteen North, of Range No. Thirteen East of the Sixth Principal Meridian. Also the alley through Blocks 241 to 253 inclusive. The East and West boundaries of said alley being the same as Pierce Street. Also Fourth Street from the South Boundary of Blocks 267 and 268 North to the Section line between Section twenty three and twenty six in Township and Range aforesaid. Also that part of Fifth Street lying within Sixty feet of Block 266, and South of Pierce Street. Also Sixth, Seventh and Eighth Streets from the north line of Pierce Street to the line between Section twenty three and twenty six aforesaid. also Ninth Street from the south line of the alley in Block 262 and 263 North to the line between Sections twenty three and twenty six and Sections twenty two and twenty seven in Township and Range aforesaid. Also Ninth, Eleventh, and Twelfth Streets from the North line of Pierce Street to the line between Sections twenty two and Twenty Seven in Township and Range aforesaid.

Provided, that said City of Omaha shall within ten years from this time open and grade Pierce Street from its junction with Sixth Street through to the Missouri River in a good substantial manner, making an easy practicable grade, sufficient to admit the passage of heavy loaded teams and provided further, that said City of Omaha shall not close up any of said Streets or alleys, or sell or dispose of the same, or any part of them, but the said aforesaid Streets and alleys shall be forever open to public use as Streets and alleys and for no other purpose.

Provided further, that the property of the aforesaid Samuel E. Rogers and Martha Rogers, on said Pierce Street, shall not be used for opening or grading the same, to have and to hold the above described Streets and alleys, with the aforesaid conditions unto the said City of Omaha forever. Otherwise this conveyance to be null and void. Signed this twenty seventh day of September AD 1854 (us but Recd 57) Sam E. Rogers

More of Omaha Nebraska, the following described Real Estate situated in the County of Douglas and Territory of Nebraska to wit; The north half of the south west quarter of section twenty six (26) and the north east quarter of the south east quarter and the south east quarter of the north east quarter of section twenty seven (27) in Township Fifteen (15) north of Range in (10) East. Except the following described tract which was conveyed by James B. Allen and wife to Allen Marshall by deed dated November 24<sup>th</sup> 1850 and recorded in Book N of Deeds Page 363 of the Records of Douglas County Nebraska, to wit Commencing at the north east corner of the south west quarter of said section twenty six (26) thence South six (6) chains and Eighty Eight<sup>88</sup> Links, thence west twenty one (21) chains and Sixty nine (59) links to the left bank of the Elk Horn river - thence north easterly along said river to the north boundary of said quarter section, thence East Sixteen<sup>16</sup> chains and Seventy five (75) links to the place of beginning and containing thirteen and  $\frac{2}{3}$  acres. hereby excepting and reserving from the operation of this deed a certain saw mill situate on said premises owned by J.
