

And the ordinances to amend, and the ordinances entitled,
"An ordinance to vacate and set apart to the
Union Pacific Railroad Company a strip of ground,
thirty three feet in width from "E" to "F" Streets,
and on the west side of Twenty seventh street, and
the Twenty Road for wagon grounds and other
improvements, in the City of South Omaha,
Nebraska."

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council
of the City of South Omaha, Nebraska,

Section 1

That section three (3) of an ordinance entitled

"An ordinance to vacate and set apart to
the Union Pacific Railroad Company a strip
of ground thirty three feet in width from "E" to
"F" Streets, and on the west side of Twenty seventh
street and the Twenty Road for wagon grounds
and other improvements, in the City of South
Omaha, Nebraska," passed September 19th 1887, be,
and the same is hereby amended so as to read,
as follows:

"Section 1. That a strip of ground, thirty three
feet in width to the west side of 27th street and
Twenty Road, from "E" to "F" Streets in the City of
South Omaha, Nebraska, be set apart to the Union Pacific
Railroad Company for its use."

Section 2

This ordinance shall take effect and be
in force from and after its passage and
approval.
