The United States of America,  
To All to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:  
Whereas there has been deposited in the General Land Office  
of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the  
Land Office at West Point Nebraska, whereby it appears  
that pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20<sup>th</sup> May  
1862, "To secure Homesteads to actual Settlers on the  
Public Domain", and the acts supplemental thereto,  
the Claim of Timothy Dooley has been established  
and duly enumerated, in conformity to law, for  
the North East quarter of Section Three, in Township  
Twenty one North, of Range five East, in the District  
of lands formerly subject to sale at West Point, now  
York Nebraska, containing one hundred and  
fifty nine acres and seventeen Hundredths of an acre,  
according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said  
Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General,  
Now know ye, that there is, therefore, granted by the  
United States unto the said Timothy Dooley the tract  
of Land above described: To have and to hold the said  
tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto  
the said Timothy Dooley and to his heirs and assigns  
forever.

In testimony Whereof, I, Ulysses S. Grant, President  
of the United of America, have caused these Letters  
to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land  
Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand, at the City of Washington,  
the fifteenth day of April, in the year of our Lord  
our thousand eight hundred and eighty five, and of the  
Independence of the United States the thirty-third.
