AN ORDINANCE declaring the necessity of acquiring

) an easement across and under certain private property and lands

The Public) for the use of the city of Omaha, for the purpose of constructing and maintaining a 4 foot 6 inch diameter sewer across and under Lot 8, Block 5, Brookline Addition in the City of Omaha, and providing for the appointment of three disinterested freeholders thereof of said City to assess the damages to the owners respectively, of the property affected by the acquisition of such easement.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OMAHA:

Section 1. That it is proper and necessary and it is hereby declared proper and necessary to acquire an easement across and under certainprivate property and lands for the use of the City of Omaha, for the purpose of constructing and maintaining a 4 foot 6 inch sewer, said property and lands necessary for such purpose being situated in said City of Omaha and described as follows:

Beginning at a point on the South line of Center Street 184.8 feet Southwesterly from the North line of Lot 8, Block 5, Brookline Addition; thence in a southeasterly direction along a line making an angle of 76 degrees 26 minutes with the Southerly line of Center Street West of 55th Street for a distance of 100 feet more or less to Saddle Creek.

Section 2. That the Mayor, with the approval of the City Council, appoint three disinterested freeholders of the City of Omaha to assess the damages to the owners, respectively of said property and lands affected by the aquisition of said easement.

Section 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force after fifteen days from and after its passage.
