The appropriation of water shall not exceed three acre-feet for each irrigated acre of land above enumerated during one calendar year measured at the point of diversion on each bank of Big Fapillion Creek in the W_2^1 of the SE_2^1 of Section 19, Township 14 North, Range 12 East of the 6th P.M., nor the least amount of water necessary for the production of crops in the exercise of good husbandry; neither shall the diversion of the water appropriated for use upon the land above enumerated, amounting to 53.3 acres, exceed 0.38 cubic foot per second of time measured at the point of diversion on the bank of said creek.

The quantity of water diverted at any time shall be restricted to the acreage irrigated in proportion to the total acreage enumerated herein; and provided further, said appropriation of water under any circumstances shall be limited to an annual diversion of three acre-feet per acre of land on which water is actually and usefully applied on or before October 1, 1958.

The applicant will be permitted, as provided by Section 46-231, Revised Statutes of Nebraska, 1943, to use as much water as he is able to handle efficiently for a limited time each day in lieu of a continuous flow.
