

On the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of August, 1907. A petition signed by Adam Mohr, Jr. and 21 others, was filed with the County Clerk, asking for the location of a County road as follows: Commencing on Section line between Sections 19<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup>, on County Road, Twp. 13 Range 12, and running thence west  $2\frac{1}{4}$  miles more or less, on sect. in line to connect with public road already located, Also commencing at the N.W. corner of the S.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of S.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 14, Twp. 13, Range 12, and running thence south  $1\frac{1}{4}$  miles more or less, to Platte river, and terminating at said point.

On the 28<sup>th</sup> day of August, 1907. C. B. Tower was appointed Commissioner to view and report upon the expediency of the proposed road, and on Sept. 7, 1907, said Commissioner filed his report, which was favorable to the opening of the following portion of said road:

Commencing at the County road between sections 19<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup> and running thence west to the S.W. corner of the Chase Farm, thence North to the County Road. That the road start at about 100 feet south of the place where the creek runs nearest the road in Sections 19<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup>, being about on the Section line, running thence west across creek with a 32 ft. bridge, thence across creek bottom to a sort of a swail in the higher ground, thence to a point 80 rods East of the corners of Sections 24, 25, 19<sup>th</sup> and 30, thence west on Section line to the S.W. corner of the Chase farm as shown on above plat, thence north on the division line between the lands of Chase, and Zwiibel and Thiering and Beerline to the County road, with a 32 ft. bridge between the lands of Chase and Zwiibel, and a slight bearing to the west of 2 rods by 10 rods north and south at a point about 20 rods south of the last mentioned bridge. Reports unfavorable on the balance of the road described in said petition.

Whereupon, the Clerk issued the necessary "Notice to land owners" and caused the same to be served and published as required by law, notifying all persons having claims for damages or objections thereto file same in the office of County Clerk, on or before noon on the 14<sup>th</sup> day of November 1907 for said part of road would be located without reference thereto and in response thereto claims for damages were filed as herein below stated.

Afterwards on the 14<sup>th</sup> day of November, 1907, the clerk appointed Fred Trumble, John Welsh, and Perry Jamman, as appraisers to view and fix the amount of damages sustained by said claimants and on the 30<sup>th</sup> day of November 1907 said appraisers filed their report fixing damages as herein below stated.

On the 27<sup>th</sup> day of September 1907 objections to the location of said road signed by Chas. Pflug, and 27 others was filed in said matter.

Afterwards to wit: On the 5<sup>th</sup> day of August 1908 this matter came on to be heard before the board of County Commissioners

upon the proceedings herin filed and the following resolution was passed by said board;

August 5, 1908. Where-as, this cause came up for hearing, this date, and the Board deems it for the public good to open the following road, to-wit: Commencing at the N.W. corner of the S.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the S.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of section 14, Twp 13, Range 12, East of 6th P. M. and running thence south on Sub-quarter line  $1\frac{1}{4}$  miles and terminating at the S.W. corner of the S.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of S.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 23 Twp. 13, Range 12, East 6th P.M., therefore be it resolved that the same is hereby established and the over. sec. of said District be instructed to open said Road for travel, and that damages for land taken be allowed as follows:

Note:— The claims of John N. Chace, Christing Beerline, were appealed and later adjudicated in District Court.

Fred Thiering brought suit in District Court and had that part of the above road which affected his property annulled.

Later:— On the third day of August 1909 the board of County Commissioners settled with Fred Thiering by payment of the sum of \$300 for 2 acres of land taken and all damages building and moving fences (See claim no. 84)
