AN ORDINANCE vacating certain streets and alleys in the village of Bethany Heights, Nebraska, and providing that said streets and alleys so vacated shall revert to the owners of the real estate adjacent there- to one-half on each side thereof.

Whereas the Chairman and Board of Trustees of the Village of Bethany Heights, Nebraska did on March 9, 1909 duly pass and the Chairman of said Board of Trustees did on said date duly approve an ordinance which was thereafter on March 12, 1909 duly published as by law required in the Christian Reporter, a newspaper published in and of general circulation in said village of Bethany Heights, declaring the expediency and necessity of vacating certain streets and alleys in said village and providing for the election and compensation of five disinterested householders to assess the damages sustained thereby, and said Chairman and Board of Trustees, pursuant to the terms of said ordinance, did on March 15, 1909 elect as said five disinterested householders to make said
