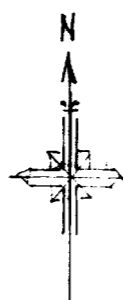


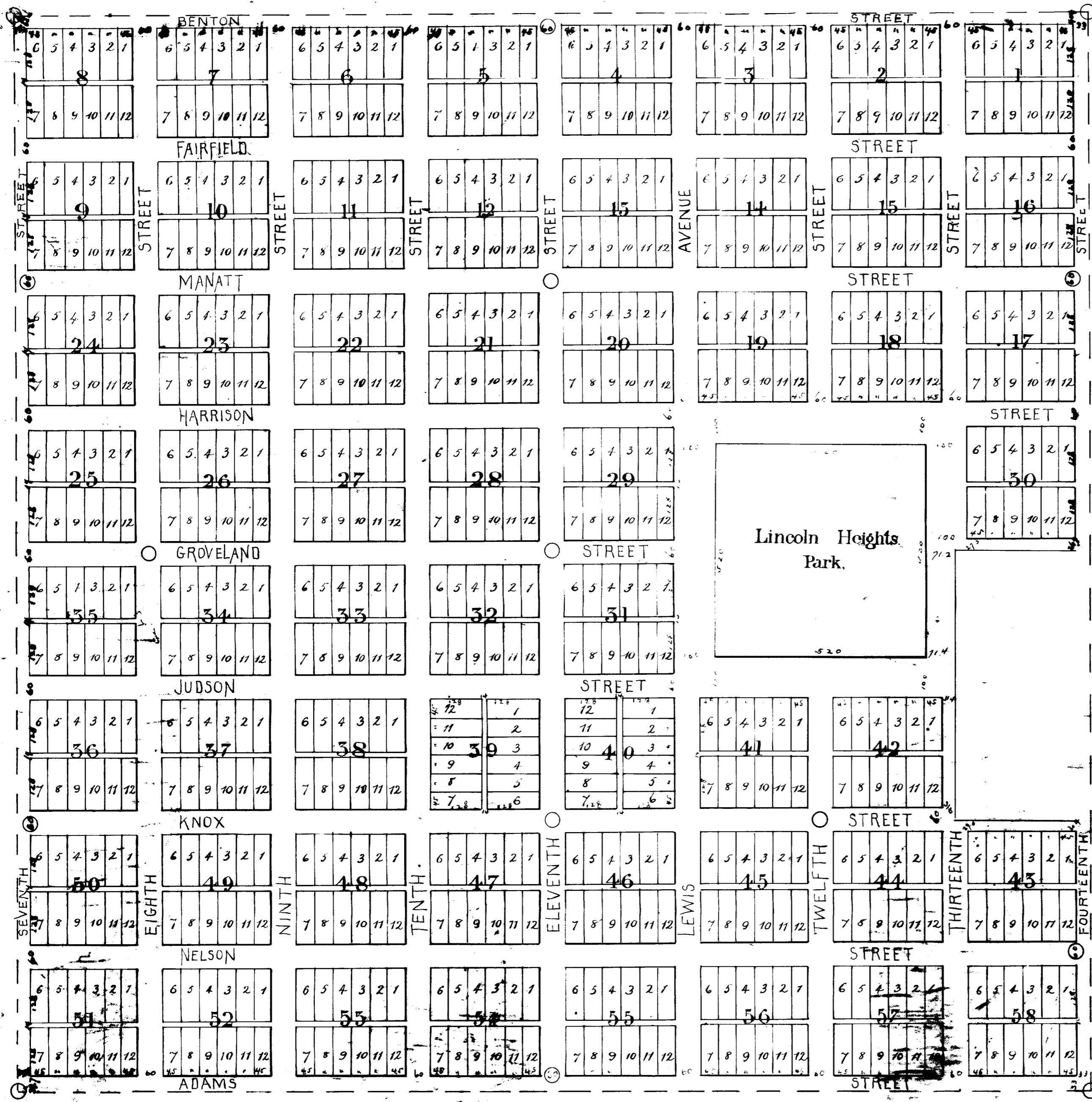
LINCOLN HEIGHTS,

Lincoln Heights Addition to Lincoln Neb. comprises all of the SE 1/4 of Section 11, T10N, R6E of the Sixth Principal Meridian, except the E 1/2 of NE 1/4 of SE 1/4 of SE 1/4 of said Section 11. All streets are 60 feet wide except boundary streets, those adjoining Lincoln Heights Park, and adjoining said E 1/2 of NE 1/4 of SE 1/4 of SE 1/4, and they have dimensions as marked on the plat. All alleys are 14 feet wide, all lots are 45 by 125 feet. Lincoln Heights Park is 520 feet square. All lot lines are parallel with or at right angles to the east line of said SE 1/4 of Sec. 11. Oak stakes are set at all lot corners on the block lines, stones are set at points marked thus: O
