Whereas in pursuance of the
act of Congress approved
March 3, 1805 entitled "an act
in addition to certain acts
granting Bounty Land to certain
Officers and Soldiers who have
been engaged in the military
service of the United States there has been deposited in
the General Land Office a warrant No 27092 for 160 acres
in favor of Rachel Phelps widow of Eli Phelps private
Revolutionary War with evidence that the same has
been duly located upon the North half of the South
East quarter of Section six and the West half of the
South West quarter of Section Five in Township Eight
North of Range Seven East in the district of Lands
subject to sale at Omaha Nebraska City Nebraska containing
One hundred and sixty acres according to the official
plat of the survey of the said Land returned to the
General Land office by the Surveyor General.

The said Warrant having been assigned by Garnet

Phelps Administrator of the Estate of the said Rachel Phelps deceased to James M. Bracken in whose favor said Tract has been located.

Know ye that there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said James M. Bracken as assignee as aforesaid and to his heirs the tract of Land above described. To have and to hold the said tract of Land with the appurtenances thereof unto the said James M. Bracken as assignee as aforesaid and to his heirs and assigns forever.
