The United States of America, To all to whom these presents shall come greeting:
 Know all men, In pursuance of the Act of Congress approved July 2 1862, entitled "An
 act donating Public lands to the several States and Territories which may pro-
 vide colleges for the benefit of agriculture and the mechanic arts, there has
 been deposited in the General Land Office Scrip No 2759 for one quarter section
 of land in favor of the State of Illinois (duly assigned by the proper authority)
 of the said State to the Illinois Industrial University, and by its officers to
 Andrew W. Wickell with evidence that the same has been located upon the
 North East Quarter of Section Twenty One in Township Six North of Range Seven
 East in the district of lands formerly subject to sale at Brownville now
 Deatrice Nebraska containing one hundred and sixty acres, according to the
 official Plat of the Survey of the said land returned to the General Land Office
 by the Surveyor general: Now know ye, that there is therefore granted by the
 United States unto the said Andrew W. Wickell, as assignee as aforesaid
 and to his heirs the tract of land above described: To have and to hold,
 the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said
 Andrew W. Wickell as assignee as aforesaid and to his heirs and assigns
 forever.

In testimony whereof, I, Ulysses S. Grant, President of the United States of
 America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the
 General Land Office to be hereunto affixed,

Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, the Twentieth day of
 July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty two
 and of the Independence of the United States the thirty fourth.
