To all To Whom These Presents Shall Come, Greeting
 Homestead Certificate No. 2214 Whereas There has been deposited in
 Application 3490 } the General Land Office of the United
 States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Beatrice
 Nebraska, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress
 approved 2nd May, 1862, "To secure homesteads to actual Settlers on the
 Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of
 Alice E. Bailey formerly Alice E. Jones has been established and
 consummated, in conformity to law, for the

South half of the North East quarter and the North half of
 the South East quarter of Section eight in Township
 2-3-8 two North, of Range three, East in the district of lands
 subject to sale at Beatrice Nebraska containing one
 hundred and sixty acres

According to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said land,
 returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General
 New Haven Mo. that there is therefore, granted by the United States unto
 the said Alice E. Bailey the tract of land above described. To
 have and to hold the said tract of land with the appurtenances, so
 thereof, unto the said Alice E. Bailey and to her heirs and assigns
 forever. In testimony Whereof, I, Ulysses S. Grant,

President of the United States of America, have caused these
 letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land
 Office to be hereunto affixed

Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, the
 first day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
 hundred and seventy eight and of the Independence of the
 United States the six hundredth.
