

Protective Covenants - Continued.

III. If the present or future owners of any, all and none, or any of the
rentees, heirs, or successors, if I violate or attempt to violate any of the
covenants or restrictions herein set forth, it shall be lawful for me, or
any person or persons owning any other lots in said addition, or for any attorney
to prosecute any proceeding at law or in equity against the person responsible
for violating or attempting to violate any of the said covenants or restrictions
and either to prevent him or them from so doing or to recover damages resulting
from such violation or violations.

This paragraph shall not be construed as implying upon any person or
persons the duty of enforcing any one or all of these covenants or restrictions.

Invalidation of any one of these covenants by a judgment or court
order shall in no way affect the validity and enforceability of any of the
other covenants or restrictions herein contained.
