

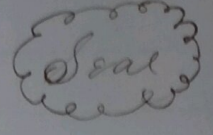
Patent To Samuel. McCallron

The United States of America — To all to whom these presents shall come greeting. — Homestead Certificate No 1078 - Application 383  
Whereas there has been deposited in the general land office of the United States a Certificate of the register of the land office at Grand Island Nebraska, whereby it appears that pursuant to the act of Congress approved 20th. May. 1862. To secure Homesteads to actual settlers on the Public domain, and the acts supplemental thereto the claim of Samuel G. McCallron, has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law for the South half of the south east quarter of Section eight, in Township Twelve North of Range seven west in the district of lands subject to sale at Grand Island Nebraska, containing eighty acres, according to the official Plat of the Survey of the said land returned to the General land office by the Surveyor General: — Now know ye that there is therefore granted by the United States, unto the said Samuel. G. McCallron the tract of land above described: to have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Samuel. G. McCallron, and to his heirs and assigns forever. In Testimony whereof, J. Ulysses. S. Grant President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent and the seal of the General land office to be hereunto affixed. — Given under my hand at the City of Washington the first day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy six and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and first.

Whereas there has been deposited in the General Land office of the United States a certificate of the register of the land office at Grand Island Nebraska whereby it appears that pursuant to the act of Congress approved 20th May 1862 To secure Homesteads to actual Settlers on the public domain: and the acts supplemental thereto the claim of Silas Fouts has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the North half of the South East quarter and the South half of the North East quarter of Section thirty two in Township Fourteen North of Range six west in the District of Lands subject to sale at Grand Island Nebraska containing One hundred and sixty acres according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said land returned to the General Land office by the Surveyor General:

Now know ye that there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said Silas Fouts, the tract of land above described: To have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof unto the said Silas Fouts, and to his heirs and assigns forever.
