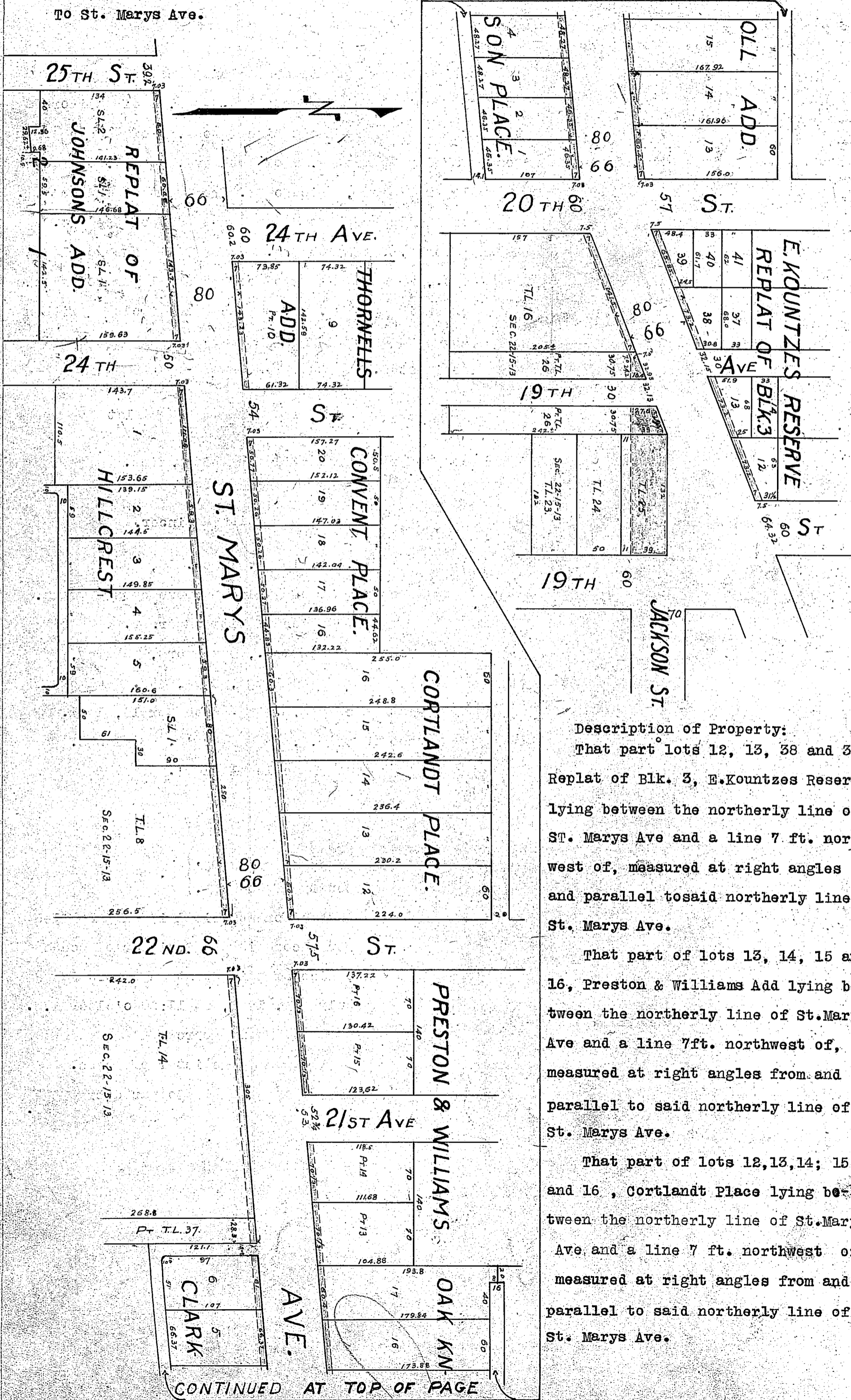

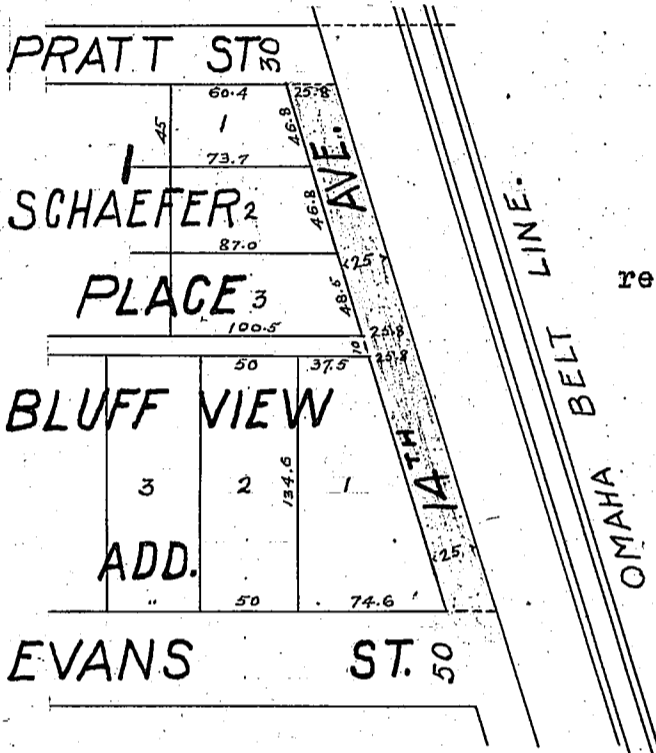

ORDINANCE NO. 10748

An Ordinance declaring St. Mary's Avenue from 19th Street to 25th Street widened and Jackson Street from 19th Street to St. Mary's Avenue extended, in the City of Omaha, and open to the public travel.

WHEREAS, It has been duly declared necessary by Ordinance No. 10660 and amending Ordinance No. 10748 to appropriate certain lands and real estate for the use of the City of Omaha for widening St. Mary's Avenue from 19th Street to 25th Street and extending Jackson Street from 19th Street to St. Mary's Avenue, and

WHEREAS, Three disinterested freeholders of the City who, after being duly sworn to perform the duties of their appointment with fidelity and impartiality have assessed the damages to the owners of the property respectively taken by such appropriation; and

WHEREAS, Such assessment has been duly reported to the City Council for confirmation and has been duly approved and confirmed; and

WHEREAS, All other requirements of law relating to the appropriation of private property for the use of the City for the purpose aforesaid have been complied with,

THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OMAHA:

Section 1. That St. Mary's Avenue from 19th Street to 25th Street be and is hereby, widened and Jackson Street from 19th Street to St. Mary's Avenue in the City of Omaha, be, and the same is hereby, declared public streets and open for public travel and to be improved as may hereafter be ordered or required.

Section 2. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force after fifteen days from and after its passage.

Whereas, It has been duly declared necessary by Ordinance No. 10660 and amending Ordinance No. 10743 to appropriate certain lands and real estate for the use of the City of Omaha for widening St. Marys Avenue from 19th Street to 25th Street and extending Jackson Street from 19th Street to St. Marys Avenue, and

Whereas, Three disinterested freeholders of the City who, after being duly sworn to perform the duties of their appointment with fidelity and impartiality have assessed the damages to the owners of the property respectively taken by such appropriation; and

Whereas, Such assessment has been duly reported to the City Council for confirmation and has been duly approved and confirmed; and

Whereas, All other requirements of law relating to the appropriation of private property for the use of the City for the purpose aforesaid have been complied with.

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OMAHA:

Section 1. That St. Marys Avenue from 19th Street to 25th Street be and is hereby, widened and Jackson Street from 19th Street to St. Marys Avenue in the City of Omaha, be, and the same is hereby, declared public streets and open for public travel and to be improved as may hereafter be ordered or required.

Section 2. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force after fifteen days from and after its passage.
