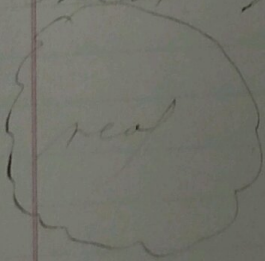

To all to whom these presents shall come greeting
Whereas John B Rogers of Jefferson County Nebraska
has deposited in the general land office of the United States a
certificate of the register of the land office at Beatrice Nebraska
whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said
John B Rogers according to the provisions of the act of Congress
of the 24th of April 1820 entitled an act making further
provisions for the sale of the public lands for the west half
of the south East quarter and the East Half of the south
West quarter of section Eighteen in Township two North
of Range two East in the district of lands subject to sale
at Beatrice containing one hundred and sixty acres
according to the official plat of the survey of the said
lands returned to the General Land Office by the surveyor
General which said tract has been purchased by the said
John B Rogers

Now know ye that the United States of America
in consideration of the premises and in conformity with
the several acts of Congress in such case made and
provided have given and granted and by these presents
do give and grant unto the said John B Rogers
and to his heirs the said tract above described to have and
to hold the same together with all the rights privileges
immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature
thereto belonging unto the said John B Rogers and to
his heirs and assigns forever

caused these letters to be made Patent and the
seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed
