that full payment has been made by the said Frederick W. Schulz according
to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April 1820 entitled
an act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands
and the acts supplemental thereto including that of 21st of April 1876

for the East half of the north east quarter the North West quarter of the North east quarter and the North east quarter of the North West quarter of section twenty three in Township seven North of range three east in the district of Land subject to sale at Lincoln Nebraska containing one hundred and sixty acres according to the official plat of the survey of the said land returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General which said tract has been purchased by the said Frederick H. Shultz Now Know Ye that the United States of America in consideration of the premises and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided

Now Give and Granted and by these presents do Give and Grant unto the said Frederick H. Shultz and to his heirs the said tract above described To Have and To Hold the same together with all the rights privileges immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereto belonging unto the said Frederick H. Shultz and to his heirs and assigns forever

In Testimony Whereof Rutherford B. Hayes President of the United States of America have caused these letters to be made Patent and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed

Given Under my hand at the City of Washington the Thirtieth day of January in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Eighty and of the Independence of the United States the One hundred and fourth
