 To all to whom these presents shall come. Greeting  
 Whereas in pursuance of the Act of Congress  
 approved March 3, 1855 entitled "An Act in  
 addition to certain Acts granting Bounty Land  
 to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been  
 engaged in the Military Service of the United  
 States" there has been deposited in the General Land Office, Warrant  
 No. 90676 for 160 acres in favor of William M. Pike, Private Captain  
 Hunts Company Kentucky Militia. Creek War with evidence that the  
 same has been duly located upon the South West quarter of the North  
 East quarter the South East quarter of the North West quarter, and the  
 North East quarter of the South West quarter and the North West quarter  
 of the South East quarter of Section Twenty Three in Township Seven North  
 of Range Three East in the District of Lands Subject to Sale at  
 Nebraska City Nebraska. Containing One hundred and sixty acres  
 according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned  
 to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General the said Warrant  
 having been assigned by the said William M. Pike to Hardin Durall  
 in whose favor said tract has been located.

Now Know Ye. That there is therefore granted by the United States  
 unto the said Hardin Durall. as aforesaid. and to his heirs the tract  
 of Land above described: To Have and to Hold the said tract of  
 Land. with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Hardin Durall as  
 Assignee, as aforesaid. and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof. J. Andrew Johnson, President of the United  
 States of America, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and  
 the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, the First day  
 of November in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight hundred and  
 Sixty five and of the Independence of the United States the Ninetieth.
