We, Oscar F. Davis, Byron Reed and John H. Kellum three disinterested Commissioners appointed by the Probate Judge of Douglas County in the Territory of Nebraska under and by virtue of an act of Congress entitled an act to amend an act entitled "An act to aid in the Construction of a Railroad and Telegraph line from the Missouri River to the Pacific Ocean and to cede to the Government the use of the same for postal military and other purposes. Approved July 1st 1867." Approved July 2nd 1864 - to appraise the damages accruing to certain lands lots premises in said County by reason of the location, construction and operation <sup>of the same</sup> of the Union Pacific Railroad Company through upon & over the same do hereby Certify that on Monday the twenty sixth day of June 1865 at 9 o'clock A.M. of said day at the Office of the County Clerk of said County we did proceed to appraise the damages from the following described lot the property of David Shepard, such appraisal being for the whole of said Lot to wit - Lot Two (2) in Block One Hundred & Twenty Seven (127) in the City of Omaha in said County and Territory as originally surveyed lithographed & platted and we did appraise the damage to said real Estate by reason of the location, construction and operation of the said railroad through upon & over the same at the sum of Twelve Dollars.
