To all to whom these presents shall come Greeting  
 Certificate N<sup>o</sup> 3838 Whereas Hiram C Reed of Saline County Nebraska has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Beatrice Nebraska, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Hiram C Reed according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24<sup>th</sup> of April 1820 entitled an Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands for the North West quarter of Section Fifteen (15) in Township Five (5) North, of Range Two (2) East in the district of lands subject to sale at Beatrice Nebraska containing one hundred and sixty acres according to the official plat of the survey of the said lands returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Hiram C. Reed. Now know ye that the United States of America in consideration of the premises and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made and provided have given and granted and by these presents do give and grant unto the said Hiram C Reed and to his heirs the said tract above described; To Have and to Hold the same together with all the rights privileges immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging unto the said Hiram C Reed and to his heirs and assigns forever

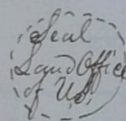
In testimony whereof I Ulysses S Grant President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made patent and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
