The United States of America.

To all whom these presents shall come greeting,

Witnessed by the act of

Acquiesced in and approved July 3rd 1864,

in virtue of the construction of an

Railroad and Telegraph Line

from the Missouri River to the

Pacific Ocean, made to secure to the

Government the use of the same for

postal, military and purposes. Authority is given to the Burlington & Missouri River Railroad Company, a corporation existing under the laws of the State of Iowa, to extend its road through the territory of Nebraska, from the point where it strikes the Missouri River, tenth of the month of the said river, to some point not further west than the confluence of the Platte River with the Missouri River, and to provide for the extension of the said road, and for the making of grants to the said Burlington and Missouri River Railroad Company, every alternate section of public land, designated by odd numbers to the amount of ten alternate sections per mile on each side of said road over the line thereof, and not sold, reserved or otherwise disposed of by the United States, and to which a preemption or homestead claim may not have attached at the time the line of said road is definitely fixed.

And Whereas by "Joint Resolution" approved April 10th 1869, the said Burlington and Missouri River Railroad Company is authorized to assign and convey to a railroad company to be organized under the laws of the State of Nebraska, all the rights powers and privileges, granted and conferred by said Act of July 2^d 1864, and subject to all the conditions and requirements therein contained, and a copy of the Articles of Incorporation, authorized by said Resolution, and bearing date May 12th 1869, has been filed in the Department.

And Whereas, by the act approved May 6th 1870, the said Burlington and Missouri River Railroad Company, or its assigns, in the State of Nebraska, may so far change the location of that portion of its line

that lies West of the City of Lincoln, in said State, as shown by the map now file in the General Land Office, so as to secure a better and more practicable route and to connect with the Union Pacific Railroad at or near the Fort Kearney reservation which map of the amended line has been duly filed in this Office.

And whereas it is indicated by letters of the Secretary of the Interior to the Commissioner of the General Land Office, dated October 13rd November 15, and December 13, 1871. — that the Commissioners appointed by the President under the provisions of the twentieth section of the said act of Congress approved July 2nd 1864, have reported to him that seven sections of Twenty miles each of said Railroad have been completed and equipped in the manner prescribed by said act and the same accepted by the President.

And Whereas certain tracts have been selected under the acts aforesaid by William T. Stearns the Agent of the Burlington & Missouri River Railroad Company, as is shown by his original lists of Selections, dated December 8th 1871, April 12th & 17th 1872, — certified under dates April 19th 1872, and May 6th 1872, by the Register & Receiver at Lincoln Nebraska, and his list of selections dated January 12th 1872, certified by the Register & Receiver at Beatrice Nebraska, April 20th, 1872, the said tracts being within Twenty miles of the line of said road, and described as follows to wit:

Now Know Ye that the United States of America
in consideration of the premises and pursuant to the said
Acts of Congress have given and granted, and by these
presente do Give and Grant unto the said Burlington and
Missouri River Railroad Company of Nebraska, and to its
assigns the tracts of lands selected as aforesaid, and decri-
bed in the foregoing, ^{not} excluding and excepting from
the transfer by these presents "All Mineral lands" should
any such be found to exist in the tracts described in the
foregoing; but this exception and exclusion, according to
the terms of the Statute, shall not be construed to include
real and personal lands.

To Have and to Hold the said Tracts
with the appurtenances unto the said Burlington and
Missouri River Railroad Company of Nebraska, and to
its assigns forever with the inclusion and exception as
aforesaid.

In Testimony Whereof I, Ulysses S. Grant,
President of the United States, have caused these letters
to be made patent, and the seal of the General Land
Office to be hereunto affixed.

the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and seventy two and of the Independence
of the United States the Ninety Sixth.
