The United States of America, To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting: Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress approved March 3, 1855, entitled "An Act in addition to certain Acts granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States" there has been deposited in General Land Office Warrant No. 72697 for 160 acres, in favor of Margaret Parker, widow of John Parker, Private, Captain Joynes Company, Virginia Militia War 1812, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the west half of the northwest quarter, the south east quarter of the northwest quarter and the north east quarter of the south west quarter of section thirtytwo in Township three North of Range Thirteen East of the Sixth Principal Meridian in the District of Lands subject to sale at Brownville, Nebraska, containing one hundred and sixty acres, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General the said warrant having been assigned by the said Margaret Parker to Albert D. S. Ayres in whose tract has been located. Now know ye, That there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said Albert D. S. Ayres, (as assignee, as aforesaid and to his heirs, the tract of Land above described: To have and to hold the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Albert D. S. Ayres, as assignee as aforesaid

and to his heirs and assigns forever. In testimony whereof, I, Abraham Lincoln, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed. Given under my hand at the City of Washington, the first day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty one, and of the Independence of the United States eighty fifth.
