The United States of America, To all
to whom these presents shall come,
Greeting: Whereas, In pursuance of the
Act of Congress, approved March 3, 1855
entitled "An Act in addition to certain
Acts granting Bounty Land to certain
Officers and Soldiers who have been
engaged in the Military Service of

the United States" there has been deposited in the General Land Office,
Warrant No 84,238 for 160 acres, in favor of Violet Jones formerly widow
of Thomas Sherrill, Private Captain Ebeys Company, Illinois Militia,
Black Hawk War with evidence that the same has been duly located
upon the East half of the North East quarter of Section one, in Township
Eight of Range Six, and the West half of the North West quarter of Section
Six, in Township Eight North of Range Seven East in the District of Lands
subject to sale at Nebraska City, Nebraska, containing One hundred Forty
eight acres and fifty six hundredths of an acre, according to the Official
Plat of the Survey of the said land returned to the General Land Office by the
Surveyor General the said Warrant having been assigned by the said Violet
Jones to George C. Walsen, in whose favor said tract has been located.

Now know ye, that there is therefore granted by the United States
unto the said George C. Walsen as assigned as aforesaid and to his heirs
the tract of land above described; To have and to hold the said tract of
land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said George C. Walsen as
assigned as aforesaid, and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, I, Abraham Lincoln, President of
the United States of America, have caused these Letters to be made Patent,
and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, the
fifteenth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and sixty four and of the Independence of the United States
the Eighty Ninth.
