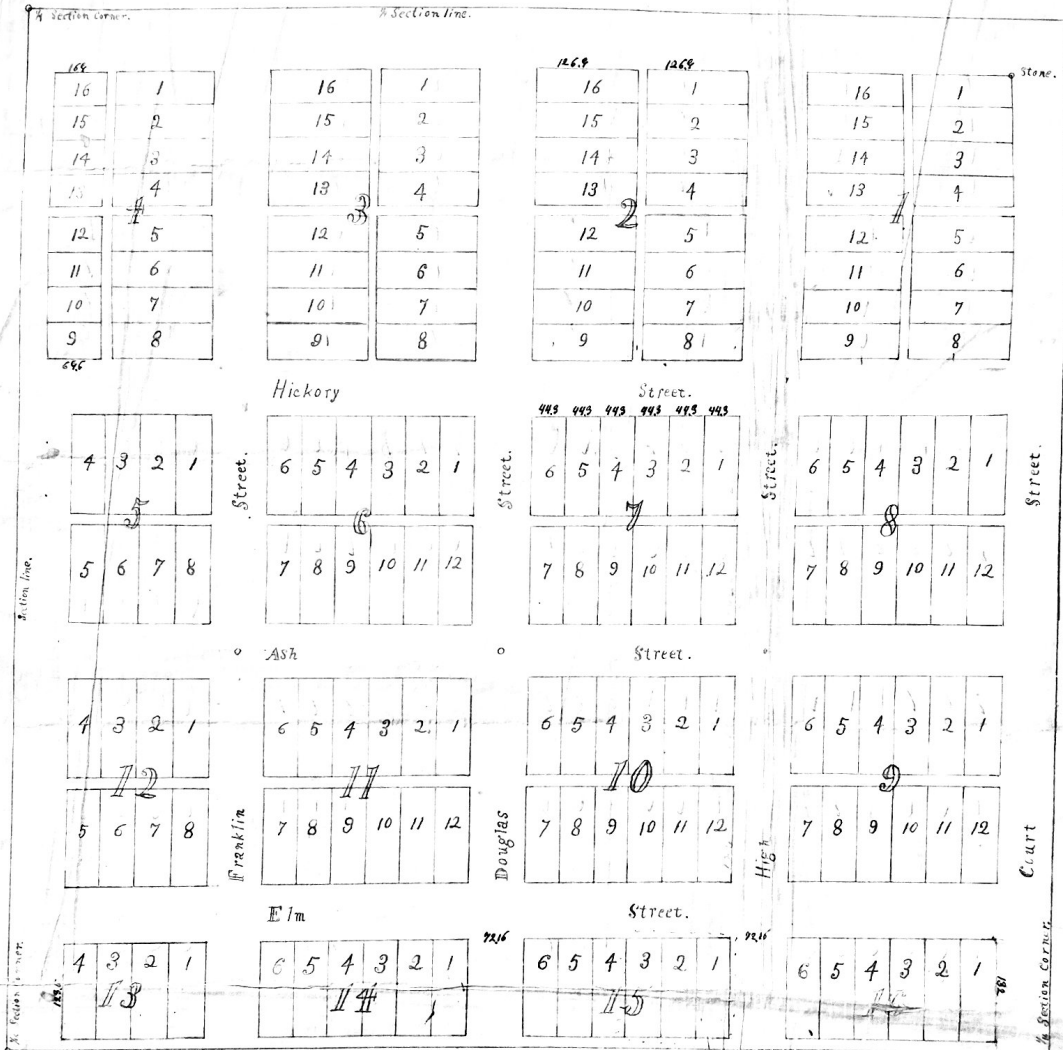


WILBER'S

THIRD ADDITION TO WILBER.



This map being that I have changed within third addition to Wilber which is situated on the south west quarter of the North west quarter of Section 15 (15) Twp. 24 N. R. 18 W. of Range Four (4) 1st. in Adams county Arkansas, and set a monument stake at each lot corner.

Regular lots are 44 x 126 feet.

Lots in Block 2 are 44 x 126 feet.

... Block 1 and 10 are 44 x 126 feet.

In Block 4 lot 16 is 28 feet long on the north side and lot 8 is 82 feet long on the south side.

Lot 1 Block 15 is 132 feet long on the east side

and lot 4 Block 13 is 123 feet long on the west side.

Elm, 4th, Hickory, High and Franklin Streets are each 70 feet wide. High and Douglas streets are each 72 feet wide.

1st Alley is 10 feet wide.

Line for monuments are set in steel pipe at the intersections of these streets and Franklin Street.

The principal lines are parallel with each other at right angles to the north line of section first addition to Wilber.

They may certify that I have surveyed willow, first addition to willow which is situated on the North West quarter of the South West quarter of section fifteen (15) Town six (6) North of Range Four (4) East in Main County, Alaska, and set a permanent stake at curve lot corner.

Regular lots are 44 x 126 feet.

Lots in Block 2 are 44 x 126.9 "

" " Blocks 7 and 10 are 44.3 x 126 "

In Block 4 lot 16 is 69 feet long on the north side and lot 9 is 69.6 feet long on the south side.

Lot 1 Block 16 is 132 feet long on the east side

and lot 4 Block 13 is 123.5 feet long on the west side.

Elm, Ash, Hickory, Court and Franklin streets are each 70 feet wide. High and Douglas streets are each 72.16 feet wide.

All alleys are 12 feet wide.

Lime stone monuments are set in Ash street at the intersections of High, Douglas and Franklin streets.

The principal lines are parallel with and at right angles to the west line of willow's first addition to willow.
