The United States of America:-
To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:
Know that certified No 571
Application 779.

Whereas There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Beatrice Nebraska whereby it appears that pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 30th May 1867 "To secure homesteads to actual settlers on the Public Domain" and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Robert Simpson has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the North East quarter of Section twenty two in Township five, North of Range New East in the District of Lands Subject to Sale at Beatrice Nebraska containing one hundred and sixty acres:- according to the official Plat of the Survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General;

Now Know ye, That there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said Robert Simpson the tract of Land above described: To have and To hold the said tract of Land with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Robert Simpson and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony Whereof Ulysses S. Grant, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, the first day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy two, and of the Independence of the United States the ninety seventh.
