We, the undersigned landholders, residents of said County, respectfully petition for the appointment of a Commissioner to examine and Locate a County Road, commencing at or near the North East corner sec. 2d, Twp. 14, Range 12,

running thence Along the North side of the N. P. Rail Road or near to same Rail Roads as may be practicable in an E. & W. direction

and terminating at or near the West side of sec. 22 - 14-12 Rail meeting with the County Road more located along said Rail Road. in sec. 22 - 14-12,

to be known as Road No. 449. Dated February 26, 1877

Notice is Herby Given, That the undersigned, inhabitants of the County of Sarpy on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of March, 1877, will apply by petition to the Board of County Commissioners of Sarpy County, Nebraska, for the appointment of a Commissioner to Locate a Public Road, commencing at or near the N. E. corner sec. 22 - 14-12 running along the side of the fence RR across as practicable, meeting with the RR road that located along same and terminating at R. B. in sec. 22 - 14-12.

## REPORT.


The undersigned, appointed a Commissioner to view, and if deemed for the public good, to Locate a Road, petitioned for by Brayshaw Peleg, and others, at the March session of the Board of County Commissioners of said County, respectfully reports that he did on the 21<sup>st</sup> day of April 1877 proceed to view the Road proposed; and being of the opinion that the public good requires the proposed Road, he did proceed to lay out, mark and plat the same according to lay, and for that purpose he did employ Charles J. Payette Surveyor, and Joseph M. Whited and William Weller, two Chain Carriers, and an Axman, who each worked One day, and he has hereto attached a copy of the plat of said Road, together with the Field Notes of the Surveyor, as a part of this Report.
