do hereby grant to SOCONY VACUUM OIL COMPANY, Incorporated, its successors or assigns, the right of way to lay, maintain, alter, repair, inspect, operate, and remove pipe lines for the transportation of oil and/or gas, and products or by-products thereof, water and other substances, together with such dips, valves, fittings, meters, and similar appurtenances as may be necessary or convenient to the operation of the said lines, on, over, or through certain lands situated in Douglas County, Nebraska, described as follows:

All of that part of E. 3, of Section 31, Township 15, Range 12, lying south of Union Pacific Railroad Right-of-Way.

with ingress and egress to and from same. The said grantor, his heirs and assigns hereby agree that no building or buildings shall be erected on or over the said pipe line, but otherwise to fully use and enjoy said premises except for the purposes hereinbefore granted to said grantee, which hereby agrees to pay any damage which may arise to crops, fences, stock, buildings, and land from the maintaining, operating, and removing of said lines, said damage if not mutually agreed upon, to be ascertained and determined by three disinterested persons, one thereof to be appointed by the grantor, his heirs or assigns, one by said grantee, its successors or assigns, and the third by the two appointed aforesaid, and the award of such persons or any two of them shall be final and conclusive. Said company, its successors and assigns, shall have the right to change the size of its pipes, the damage, if any, in making such change to be paid by the said SOCONY VACUUM OIL COMPANY, Incorporated, its successors or assigns.

Should more than one pipe line be laid under this grant, at any time, an additional consideration, calculated on the same basis per lineal rod as the consideration hereinabove recited, shall be paid for each line so laid after the first line.

All pipe laid under this grant shall be laid on a route selected by the Grantee, its successors and assigns, and shall be buried to such a depth as not to interfere with the ordinary cultivation of land.

It is understood that the within written contract constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and that no oral agreements made by the person securing this grant shall be binding upon the Grantee.

This agreement is binding on the heirs, representatives, successors and assigns of the respective parties thereto.
